What We Do

Institution Building

AVN Pragati Foundation (AVN P Foundation) strengthens community-led development by establishing and supporting village-level institutions. These are linked and supported through second-tier bodies called **AVN Community Trust Societies (SCS)**. These institutions monitor performance, strengthen networks, explore economic opportunities, and gradually take over community support functions to ensure long-term sustainability beyond (AVN P Foundation) direct involvement.

Youth Employment & Skills Development

AVN Pragati Foundation (AVN P Foundation) supports unemployed rural youth (18–35 years) by improving access to skills training and employment opportunities. We partner with sectors such as services, technology, telecommunications, garments, and agribusiness, and connect youth with vocational training, job placement, and government schemes. We maintain a youth database, form youth groups for regular engagement, and provide counseling to youth and families—helping them overcome social, informational, and mobility barriers to employment.



Monitoring, Evaluation & Learning (MEL):

AVN Pragati Foundation (AVN P Foundation) uses MEL systems to track progress, ensure transparency, and improve program effectiveness through community participation and MIS-based reporting.

Governance & Accountability:

AVN Pragati Foundation (AVN P Foundation) is a legally registered not-for-profit organization under the Indian Trusts Act, 1882. The organization was officially registered on 30 August 2012 with Registration No. 2787.

It is also registered on the NGO Darpan Portal of the Government of India with Unique ID: HR/2018/0211000, enabling transparency and collaboration with various government bodies and stakeholders.

The Foundation operates at an All-India level, implementing programs and initiatives across multiple states to promote sustainable development and community empowerment.

Neha now earns a decent livelihood, contributing to her household income and gaining financial independence.

Impact:

Neha's story reflects the transformative power of skill-based empowerment.

Her journey demonstrates that with proper training, guidance, and opportunity, differently-abled individuals can overcome barriers and achieve self-reliance.
